





I was able to take my 15 year old for his first flight. Not great weather, but we had a really good short flight through the Armstrong valley.










Jamie and Tanner had a great flight in GGHB the other day. March 5, Jamie and I did a flight to Vernon and back.




A neat flying experience that one does not get to take advantage of very often :)





















Was able to get out for a great flight to Revelstoke and back through the Lumby Valley

Final: Salmon Arm Flying Club (SAFC) Executive Meeting Agenda March 2, 10:00 am

Director

Waive directors' reports since General Meeting was held recently.

Minutes of last Executive meeting of January 2024 were not available to be read. The new Executive was introduced in around table. Airport Expo Account was added to minutes.

Aircraft:

Steve Genn noted that there are several goals the SAFC is looking at:

- 1. Undertake Club House improvements, such as new flooring, deck improvements;
- 2. Get the flying membership directly involved in club social and work party activities beyond club aircraft flying;
- 3. The president is to contact all flying members directly to increase their participation in SAFC activities;
- 4. Non-participation by flying members will only be tolerated with good reason.

Tanner Tomkins reported that Kelly had donated a SPOT tracker to help record each flight of the Club Cessna and to enable search and rescue should that be required in an emergency. The marginal cost of operating the SPOT might be reflected in the hourly charges for using then Club Aircraft.

A motion to approve installation of the SPOT and inform the pilots of its operation was tabled by Steve Genn and seconded by Tanner Tomkins.

Tanner will report on progress once the SPOT is installed.

Treasurer:

Tim Auger indicated that the Aircraft Account bank statement indicted that the account was flush as of the end of January. The General account was worth more than \$7,000. Due to the fraud issues associated with the COPA membership payment for the Executive, the SAFC lost \$985.00. The police are looking into the situation and source of the fraudulent activity. Club Aircraft Operation:

Jamie Spoletini indicated that there were unusually low temperature readings when running the C-172 engine. Measures to cover the engine to increase temperatures in cold weather did not seem to make a difference, so during the annual inspection in two weeks the temperature gauges will be inspected to see if it is a reading issue. Examination of the issue should be undertaken before the aircraft is taken on a long flight. Limited local circuits and flights may be allowed. The annual inspection is expected on March 18, 2024.

The insurance evaluation for the Club Cessna is currently undervalued, and will increase based on market value and any planned improvements to the aircraft instrumentation. It is estimated that the value will be about \$170,000 US for insurance purposes. Bill Keen indicated that the revised evaluation will come into effect in September 2024, and will be reflected in revised hourly fees for the aircraft use.

Jamie Spoletin noted that the engine overhaul cost for the Club Cessna will be about \$45K when required.

Hangar Cleanup Day;

The Club hangar is in need of a cleanup and removal of unneeded equipment and junk. Plans for the cleanup in late April will be discussed at the next Pilots' Meeting. The majority of flying members are expected to take part when the cleanup is announced.

Club House Door:

The Club House door and lock has been replaced. If you need to enter when the door is locked use the reverse code from that on the airfield gate lock, or ask one of the executives for the pass code number.

Club House Floor:

Steve and Tanner are looking at option for 2025 to replace the existing Club House carpeting. Although the building is owned by the City, it was thought that it best for the SAFC to do the work of replacing the carpet since this could be installed by volunteer members quickly and at less expense. Funds could be drawn from the Airport Appreciation Day Account. This work could be done within the next two months.

A motion was made by Steve Genn to budget a \$3,000 maximum for the floor renovation in a dark gray colour. It was seconded by Tanner Tompkins.

SAFC Membership Fees:

The annual membership fees have been fixed at \$50.00 for many years. They could be seen as covering the cost of Wednesday coffee for the year, but clearly need updating to cover general costs for the SAFC. Although no decision was made on what the final membership cost should be next year, \$100.00 per year was suggested as reasonable since the current fees have remained the same for years. Further discussion will follow before a decision on fees is finalized.

Social Events:

There is a need for more social and flying related events at the SAFC. Options include fly-ins, fund raising, COPA for Kids, inter-club coordinated events, etc. These events must be planned on a cost recovery basis. Andrew, Jamie and Tanner will look into possibilities for the coming year. Six to ten people will be needed to ensure the events can be undertaken. Events will need to be coordinated with other airport activities, including the sky divers' events. The first fly-in may be possible around the May long weekend)20th) and/or August long weekend.

New Computer:

Discussions about updating the Club computer concluded that the replacement could wait. There is no urgent need for a new computer. The meeting was adjourned at 11:40 a.m. by Anrew Affleck and seconded by Tim Auger.
